Preferred Plant List

The following list of plants has been prepared for homeowners that wish to make changes to their landscaping. The plants included in the list are intended to be used by homeowners when re-landscaping their property, so as to not increase the ongoing maintenance costs. This list is purely suggestive in nature, and is not intended to be an exclusive list of plants for use within the community.

Small Shrubs 2-3' both tall and wide

Crimson Pygmy Barberry, sun
Cotoneaster, sun to part shade low growing spreader
Carol mackie daphne, part shade to full shade Nice looking shrub
Spirea, sun to part shade, lots of different varieties. best species are neon flash, goldflame, and anthony waterer
Globosa spruce, sun, evergreen, looks like a blue spruce tree but a round 3' ball
Dwarf burning bush, sun

Medium shrubs 3-6' both tall and wide

Alpine currant, part shade to shade, can handle full sun too but not as well
Cotoneaster, sun to part shade, more of a shrub than small variety
Hydrangea, sun to part shade
Miss Kim lilac, sun to part shade
Euonymus, shade, broadleaf evergreen, several varieties

Large Shrubs 6-12' both tall and wide

Dogwood, sun to part shade, can be cut down every 3 years to control height
Full size lilac, sun to part shade
Burning bush, sun, usually does not get much bigger than 6'
Rose of sharon, sun t part shade
Ninebark, sun to part shade
Euonymus, shade, manhattan variety get quite large(10-12')

Perennials

Autumn Joy Sedum, sun
May night salvia, sun to limited shade
Coneflower, sun
Daylily, sun to limited shade
Shasta Daisy, sun
Bleeding heart, shade
Hosta, shade
